



Fireworks



Safety



- Never let children handle fireworks.
- Do not consume alcohol while handling or lighting fireworks.
- Have a fire extinguisher or a source of water near by.
- Keep a First Aid Kit nearby.
- Light only one firework at a time.
- Don't try and relight a "dud" or any firework that has failed to ignite or gone out.
- Do not throw burned out sparklers on the ground.
- Always wear proper clothing whenever you use fireworks.
- Keep fireworks away from open flames, including cigarettes. Never smoke around fireworks.
- Never throw or toss fireworks at another person or animal.
- Never carry fireworks in your pocket.
- Use fireworks only outdoors.
- Use fireworks in an open space that is clear of spectators, buildings, vehicles, debris, and flammable materials.
- Read all warning labels carefully and follow any written instructions.
- Light fireworks on a hard, level surface to help insure the stability of the items you are lighting.
- Keep body parts clear of fireworks and never look into a firework tube to see if the item has fired. When lighting a firework item, ignite the fuse and then step away to a safe distance.
- Protect your eyes.
- Never light fireworks in windy conditions.
- Respect your neighbors.
- Use common sense.
